AMENDMENT NO. 1**

*Proposed by 102nd General Assembly
(First Regular Session) SJR No. 26*

Shall the Missouri Constitution be amended to allow places where individuals, corporations, organizations, and associations provide childcare outside of the child's home to be exempt from property tax? This is intended to make childcare more available, which would support the well-being of children, families, the workforce, and society as a whole.

State governmental entities estimate the state's Blind Pension Fund could have annual lost revenue of up to \$400,000. Local governments expect an unknown fiscal impact.

**CONSTITUTIONAL
AMENDMENT NO. 4**

*Proposed by 101st General Assembly
(Second Regular Session) SS 2 SJR
No. 38*

Shall the Missouri Constitution be amended to authorize laws, passed before December 31st, 2026, that increase minimum funding for a police force established by a state board of police commissioners to ensure such police force has additional resources to serve its communities?

This would authorize a law passed in 2022 increasing required funding by the City of Kansas City for police department requests from 20% of general revenue to 25%, an increase of \$38,743,646, though the City previously provided that level of funding voluntarily. No other state or local governmental entities estimate costs or savings.

HOLDEN R-III SCHOOL DISTRICT

**SPECIAL SCHOOL LEVY ELECTION
PROPOSITION K.I.T.S.**

Shall the Board of Education of the Holden R-III School District, Missouri be authorized to increase the operating tax levy by \$0.2204 to \$3.7500 per one hundred dollars of assessed valuation for the purposes of attracting and retaining quality certified and support staff and meeting additional operating expenses?

If this proposition is approved, the adjusted operating tax levy of the District is estimated to increase by \$0.2204 from \$3.5296, currently, to \$3.7500 per one hundred dollars of assessed valuation for the 2024 Tax Year and can be applied to the assessed valuation for each year thereafter. The District intends to reduce the debt service levy by \$0.2204 per one hundred dollars of assessed valuation in order to offset the estimated \$0.2204 per one hundred dollars of assessed valuation increase to the operating levy if this Proposition is approved by the voters.

MIDWAY R-I SCHOOL DISTRICT

**SPECIAL SCHOOL BOND ELECTION
PROPOSITION MIDWAY FORWARD**

Shall the Board of Education of the Midway R-I School District, Missouri, without an estimated increase in the current debt service property tax levy, borrow money in the amount of Six Million Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$6,500,000) for the purpose of providing funds to make safety improvements; to complete drainage improvements for structural durability; to improve existing concrete and parking areas; to improve vocational education facilities; to the extent funds are available, complete other repairs and improvements to the existing facilities of the District; and issue general obligation bonds for the payment thereof?

If this proposition is approved, the adjusted debt service levy of the School District is estimated to remain unchanged at \$1.1190 per one hundred dollars of assessed valuation of real and personal property.
